1. Purpose of Report

To consider applications received for the Sport New Zealand Rural Travel Fund, and to allocate funds appropriately.

Recommendations

That the Assessment Committee

- A. Receives the report and accepts the level of significance.
- B. Agrees that the Assessment Committee allocate the Sport New Zealand Rural Travel Fund to the applications listed in attachment 1 of the report in accordance with the Sport New Zealand Rural Travel Fund guidelines and eligibility criteria.

2. Background

The Rural Travel Fund has been developed as a national initiative by Sport New Zealand in response to concerns raised by territorial authorities about the lack of participation in sport by young people living in rural communities. Geographical isolation, urban drift, lack of employment opportunities and access to mainstream funding were identified as barriers to sport participation.

The Sport New Zealand Rural Travel Fund (the fund) available in 2024/2025 is targeted at young people aged between 5 and 19 years. This is an interim measure until Sport New Zealand develops and implements a rural participation strategy.

3. Discussion

Proposal

To allocate the rural travel funds in accordance with Sport New Zealand funding guidelines and eligibility criteria. A summary of the applications received is attached as **Appendix 1**.

Grants that are allocated to clubs must be uplifted by Friday 22 November 2024, otherwise funds are carried over.

Statutory and Legal

The proposal as outlined is consistent with the Community Sport Fund guidelines.

Significance

The decision is not considered significant as it is procedural. No further analysis of impacts or community views is deemed necessary.

Funding for 2024/25

Sport New Zealand has allocated a grant of \$9,500.00 for distribution to clubs and organisations within the Central Otago district for the 2024/25 year.

The remaining balance of funding from 2023/2024 is \$7,841.10 The maximum allowable sum of \$200.00 has been deducted for advertising costs.

The Community Trust of Otago have provided a grant for the Rural Travel Fund of \$10,000.00 bring the total amount for distribution to \$27,141.10 for the 2024/25 year.

Funding Guidelines

Applications for the fund is open to rural sports clubs and rural school teams with young people aged between 5-19 years who require subsidies to assist with transport expenses to local sporting competitions, with the exception of some local sports groups e.g., Dunstan Arm Rowing Club, where there is no local competition for them to participate in and they have to travel out of the district for local competition.

Sport New Zealand has not set any guidelines determining what the levels of contribution should be but recommend that committees consider applications relating to the needs of the individual organisations.

Rural Travel Fund 2023 Snapshot



JULY 2022 - JUNE 2023

Sport NZ's Rural Travel Fund (RTF) helps lower travel barriers for rural sport clubs and school teams where players aged between 5 and 19 years require subsidies to assist with transport expenses to local sporting competitions. 35 Territorial Authorities receive support through this fund.

Investment into the Rural Travel Fund for the period 2003-2024 totals \$8,182,634. This includes an additional one-off payment* paid out over two years in 2022-23 / 2023-24 of \$304,110 to assist with cost of living and fuel cost increases.





Investment by Ethnicity (School Only)




Participation Data

The Rural Travel Fund impacted 5,340 more tamariki and rangatahi in 2022-23 than in the previous year. While the reasons for this are unclear, additional one-off funding provided through the Rural Travel Fund to support those living in rural areas, affected by fuel and cost of living pressures, will likely have contributed to this increase.
